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A thuismitheoirí, a chairde,

Le cúpla bliain anuas, tá an Bord Bainistíochta, le cabhair ó thuismitheoirí agus le tacaíocht Chairde na Scoile ag iarraidh naíonra a thógáil ar an suíomh scoile. Tá go leor oibre déanta maidir le pleananna ailtire a fháil agus neart eolais a chur ar fáil don Roinn Oideachais & Scileanna. Bheadh an tseirbhís seo iontach do phobal na scoile, mór áis réamhscolaíochta agus iarscoile lán-Ghaeilge a chabhródh go mór le thuismitheoirí pháistí óga. Cé go bhfuil gach ceist a chur an Roinn orainn freagartha go cuimsitheach againn, agus nach mbeadh airgead na Roinne Oideachais & Scileanna i gceist, níl an Roinn sásta ag an bpointe seo, cead a thabhairt dúinn naíonra a thógáil ar an suíomh.

Ba mhór agam é dá scríobhfadh an oiread thuismitheoirí agus is féidir chuig a ionadaithe pobail áitiúla ag lorg an chead, an tseirbhís riachtanach seo, a chur ar fáil ar shuíomh na scoile, nó go n-ardóidís leo é agus iad ag imeacht timpeall ar na tithe ag lorg votaí. Tá litir shamplach ar fáil ar an suíomh idirlín mar chabhair chuige seo.

For the past few years, the Board of Management, with the help of parents and the support of Cairde na Scoile, has been striving to build a Naíonra on the school campus. To this, end a lot of effort, including architect's plans and submissions of information to the Department of Education & Skills, has gone into the project. This service would be of enormous benefit to the school community, as a pre-school and after-school resource, that would greatly help parents of young children. Despite the fact that we have comprehensively addressed and allayed the Department's concern's and that the project would not draw from the Department of Education & Skills' financial resources, the Department will not grant us permission to build a naíonra on site at this point in time.

I would greatly appreciate it, if as many parents as possible, would write to their respective public representatives, requesting them to seek to have this permission granted or, at the very least, raise it with them as they hope to garner votes travelling from house to house.
